Who Are We & Why Are We Here?




- Bob McClenahan, retired engineer, & Heather McClenahan, writer




Don't Stay in the Same Rut; Try New ... Everything

Traveling With a Pet in Panamá

- Don't believe everything you read on the internet!
- Check with the official Panamanian embassy website for the latest information
- Use a professional pet shipper
- Remember not all vets speak English
- The Central American jungle has icky things that suburban American dogs just don't usually come into contact with
- Pet grooming, even for a husky, in Panamá City, is inexpensive
- Traveling with a pet is a great way to meet people!



In Spite of All That: Why We (Probably) Won't Live in Panamá

- Panamanian government had been very "live and let live," one aspect of Panamá we found to be attractive
- COVID-19 lock downs were some of the most restrictive in the world, including eight weeks of dry laws
- Corruption, which may, or many not, affect ex-pats (such as huge fines for breaking lockdown rules)
- The government is looking at changing the Friendly Nations Visa
- It wasn't expensive, but it wasn't as cheap as we thought it might be
 - Part of it was not understanding all the rules (short-term rental, liability insurance on the rental car)
- We still have other places we want to explore like Costa Rica and Belize
